- 4. In the days of despair--your strength--Psalm 42:5, Proverb 13:12, Isaiah 26:3 & 4, Romans 15:13
- 5. In the days of disease--your strength--Exodus 15:26, Psalm 103:3, 2 Corinthians 12:9
- 6. In the days of difficulty--your strength--Psalm 34:19, 1 Corinthians 10:13, 1 Peter 4:12 & 13
- 7. In the days of defeat--your strength—Psalm 103:12 & 13, Romans 8:37, 2 Corinthians 2:14
- 8. In the days of death--your strength--Psalm 23:4, 2 Corinthians 5:8, 1 Thessalonians 4:13

The day is often in scripture put for the events of the day; and, taking it so here, it is a promise that God would graciously support them under their trials and troubles, whatever they were. And so it is a promise sure to all the spiritual seed of Abraham that God will wisely proportion their graces and comforts to the services and sufferings he calls them out to.
